Airway disease is highly prevalent among Veterans and leads to worsened quality of life, lost work and personal time to illness, and increased risk of death. Evidence-based clinical practice guidelines exist, but clinician adherence is variable. Determining adherence rates could improve guideline adherence improvement efforts within the VA; however, methods to measure uptake have been unreliable. Our study develops a novel way to measure airway disease guideline adherence by iteratively developing, refining, and validating an electronic health record-based, natural language processing-enhanced model to measure rates of adherence and changes over time. Our data will inform a future study seeking to improve guideline adherence that will ultimately lead to enhanced

care for millions of Veterans living with asthma and COPD.

Understanding the In Vivo Dynamics of Macrophage and T-cell Mediated Rejection of Beta Cell Replacement Therapies Using Multiplex SPECT Imaging

Objective Quantification of Vitreous Inflammation Using Optical Coherence Tomography

We will perform a secondary analysis using the longitudinal OCT image dataset from the NEI-funded “First Line antimetabolite as steroid-sparing agent” (FAST) Uveitis Trial, which consists of 216 patients with non-infectious intermediate, posterior, and pan-uveitis with monthly OCT obtained for a period of 12 months.⁹ We hypothesize that OCT will improve measurement of vitreous inflammation in uveitis involving the posterior segment by objectively quantifying vitreous cell and haze in such patients. We will tie these objective measures to clinical outcomes in the FAST trial and create a risk-stratification model to identify objective measurement thresholds that may predict vision loss and ocular complications.

Socioeconomic and Neurocognitive Mechanisms of Tobacco Uptake in Diverse Adolescent Minority Groups

This project will analyze data of about 2000 9-10-year-old California youth in the ABCD study who are followed longitudinally from age 12 to 14. We will combine multi-level data, including social context (neighborhood, family, and peers), stress, structural, diffusion, and functional MRI40-44, and behaviors to examine how MDRs contribute to inequalities in youth tobacco initiation, regular use, and co-use and associated brain circuits. We focus on four brain pathways with implications for substance/tobacco use: (a) emotion regulation, (b) inhibitory control, (c) reward processing, and (d) cognitive control. Regions of interest (ROIs) include the medial prefrontal cortex (mPFC), dorsolateral prefrontal cortex (dlPFC), ventrolateral prefrontal cortex (vlPFC), anterior cingulate cortex (ACC), insula, amygdala, hippocampus, striatum, and caudate.
